

This Book made history by questioning religion, faith and God.


It erodes ancient beliefs - was it Christianity or the Pagan religion, was Jesus married or not and other similar doubts in the minds of people for centuries.

### Wallace at his best!


What happens when a man starts thinking that he can run the world as per his wish?

# ENGLISH AUGUST BY UPAMANYU CHATTERJEE


#### Routine is not boring

Charlotte despises herself and begins to believe that her husband, Max still loves Rebecca and that she is no good for him, (according to the housekeeper, Mrs. Danver).


**Phase 2:** However, the truth comes out soon. Actually Max had always hated Rebecca because of her liaisons with other men.

The novel works on a premise of genetic implants & cloning – where the products are sexually violent males, much on the lines of X-Files.


Jeanie Ferrami, genetic researcher is able to locate identical twins born to different mothers, hence uncovering a horrible truth.

After his master's death, Cathy's brother, Hinley, who hates Heathcliff, turns him into a slave and mistreats him.


Heathcliff continues to tolerate all the bad treatment for the sake of Cathy, but his life shatters when Cathy too decides to marry Edward because they are socially equal.

# THE LOVE MACHINE BY JACQUELINE SUSAN


## An encyclopedia of human relationships.

- 2) Robin Stone, the Love Machine: whom Amanda loves deeply, but Robin's bad past (a prostitute mother) has made him unemotional. He only uses women for his physical needs. He loves Amanda, but will not commit.
- 3) Ike Ryan Initially Ike Ryan for Amanda is only a physical attraction, but she decides to marry him to enjoy matrimonial bliss.

Ike & Robin clash over Amanda when they discover that she has cancer and cannot live. That is how Ryan ends up marrying her.

## JANE EYRE BY CHARLOTTE BRONTE


## Classic All The Way

## A Very Unconventional Story


The unconventional story of a beautiful girl named Dana.

A Novel, closest to my heart. The background of Lucknow is so realistic, as is the story.



Devdas is a young man in love with his childhood sweetheart, Paro.


However, the families do not agree to this match and get Paro married to another man (twice her age).

Freddie is practical and intelligent, but refuses to join the business.


Michael saves his father from an attack and slowly succeeds him in the business to become an equally loved, successful and powerful don.

Pip lives with his bullying older sister and her kind husband


A gentle, convict secretly helps Pip financially whom he met in the graveyard on one cold Christmas evening.

#### Makes the Heart Cry



"If she had known him – truly she would have never loved him. If she had known him truly she would have never lost him."


The above two lines sum up the entire book.

Roark is a brilliant architect with poor PR. Gets expelled from college, while Peter tops the batch, even though Peter was always helped/guided by Roark.


All through life, Roark faces opposition because he dares to be different.

Ashely, the main protagonist suffers from Multiple Personality Disorder.


She has two alter Egos – Toni (the extrovert singer) & Alette (the introvert painter). Toni is the dominating Ego.

Charles is nurturing a broken heart, because his wife Carole divorces him to marry Simon.


Charles turns bitter towards life, until he comes to Shellbourne hills to Gladys, who is like a mother to him.



Attorney, Jennifer Parker, loses her first court case because of a conspiracy by Mafia Don, Michael Moretti (Mike).


Adam Warner, another successful lawyer, supports her during this crisis and fall in love with her.

Roc Pendorric sweeps her off her feet, taking her to the ancient family home of the Pendorrics, in Cornwall.


She is the much-anticipated Bride of Pendorric, a name that gives her pride and respect.

Shekhar and Lalita share a special bond since childhood. They are not aware that this bond is actually love.


Girinder, walks in their life - falls for Lalita – only to make the couple realize their true feelings for each other and take a big decision.

Hassan is his loyal friend and aid, who can do anything for Amir.


However, in the 1970s, Afghanistan had its own issues and people from the lower caste (Hazara) like Hassan had a tough life.

This book is the story of two women, Mariam and Laila, who are quite different from each other, yet brought together by unfortunate circumstances.


How their friendship develops and how they support each other makes the crux of this book.

#### Many Lives, Many Tales - all in one!



#### A Roller Coaster Ride


Holden Caulfield, the main protagonist of this book is a teen icon, a rebel who criticizes the superficial ways of the society with his sarcasm and humour.

Irenie refuses to accept the fact that her mother has gone. She lives in an illusion, with her mother's scent and sounds filling the vacuum of the house and her life.


Five years later, Irenie comes across a box of Yasmeen, full of passionate and intimate love letters to Ahmed, a man she had loved all her life.




Alex has to watch Mallory (as per order), for she is trying to extract information.

#### You Can't Live with Them, You Can't Live without Them


Truly, a Classic Guide to surviving the Opposite Sex. A bible on relationships. If you are finding problems in your relationship, reading this book might be helpful.

Soon, Gus confesses to Hazel that his cancer has returned. The two continue to love and support each other during the hard times.


Gus dies, leaving Hazel heartbroken. Peter Van Houten comes at Gus's funeral to apologize, but Hazel does not forgive him.

The twist in the tale is when Mayank finds his woman in Revathi, married and much older than him.


What follows is complicated and dangerous.

To come out of this situation, she plans to travel the world for an entire year.



Each thing adds to Gopal's bewilderment, as he explains in the letters, he writes to his brother in a funny "English" language.


Gopal's inability to understand the language, results in humorous as well as embarrassing situations, which the reader thoroughly enjoys.

Depressed and devastated, Charles decides to end his life. He goes out on a drunken driving rampage that results in an accident.


